

I hope you had an enjoyable summer and are getting back into the swing of things with the new school year. It's been another busy yet rewarding summer for the Child Nutrition Programs.

SCN announced earlier this year the creation of a School Meal Programs Focus Group. The purpose of the Focus Group is to assist SCN with understanding what challenges exist across the state and to create solutions that will be beneficial for all. Currently the Focus Group consists of ten school food service directors, plus several SCN staff members. The School Meal Programs Focus Group members are excited to share an update on their work. The Focus Group members surveyed child nutrition directors to get a better idea of what challenges exist throughout Kentucky and which of those challenges are currently of highest priority. The survey was released in late August via the SCN Weekly Update. At a meeting in early October, the Focus Group members reviewed and discussed the results and decided to focus their efforts in the area of education of administrators and other stakeholders on program requirements for the National School Lunch Program. The Focus Group members want to ensure that the project they focus on will be beneficial to all programs across Kentucky. The next meeting for the Focus Group will be in November to create the project action plan and get to work! SCN is very excited for this collaborative work opportunity.

There is a lot of exciting discussion occurring, at both the federal and state levels, focused on Child Nutrition and the Child Nutrition Programs. We will continue to monitor and engage in these conversations and will keep you updated through the Weekly Update as any changes occur. Also, check out what's happening in SFSP in a separate Challenger article.

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

SFSP Article for Challenger Fall 2023

SFSP had another notable year with the implementation of permanent noncongregate meals in rural designated areas. This change was provided as a result of passage of the Consolidate Appropriations Act of 2023, along with the options of parent/guardian meal pick-up and service of multiple days of meals. As a result of these flexibilities, and the continued great work of our sponsors, nearly 5,150,000 meals and over 107,000 snacks were served this past summer! Sponsors using the new options followed USDA guidance provided in memorandums and we await the Interim Final Regulation to be released later this year for regulatory guidance. This release of new regulation will shape our training development and your plans for SFSP meals in 2024. We will provide guidance soon after the Final Regulation is released. Another result of the Consolidated Appropriations Act is Summer EBT starting in 2024. Summer EBT is not intended to replace SFSP meals, but to supplement what children in eligible families receive. It will work in concert with your Summer meals program! The details about Summer EBT will also be revealed when the new regulation is released. These changes to the SFSP should yield some great best practices from our sponsors. We are always eager to hear from you if you want to share your experience!

FDUCATION

In 2023 we returned to in-person training, which was very well-attended. We enjoyed seeing so many sponsors again! Our team chooses to travel to your area of the state and provide training so that your travel is minimized. Why attend in-person training? It is a great opportunity to ask questions of the KDE SFSP Team, and it provides a forum to discuss your SFSP with your peers. You might pick up some new ideas for your 2024 SFSP! We will announce dates for training soon so that you can plan to attend.

We look forward to working with you all in 2024!

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
